VAFA Coaches Code of Conduct

The VAFA aims to provide young males with the opportunity to play an enjoyable and competitive game of Australian Rules football in a safe environment. This code of conduct has been developed to give coaches an understanding of their responsibilities to ensure these objectives are met.

VAFA expectations of Coaches:

- All coaches should make every effort to introduce themselves to the umpires of the day
- All coaches should make every effort to introduce themselves to each other prior to the match
- Coaches should be conscious of the VAFA guidelines and ensure that players uphold the Amateur ethos
- Coaches should ensure that they conduct themselves in a manner that fosters family football
- Coaches are to refrain from:
 - Audible obscenity
 - o Intimidating and aggressive behaviour
- Coaches are encouraged to provide constructive feedback on umpires performance through to the General Manager - Umpires Operations
- Coaches should shake hands after the match and encourage all assistants and players to attend host's social facilities
- All coaches where possible should acknowledge the efforts of officials that have participated on the day directly after the match
- Coaches should encouraged high performing players to participate in representative football
- Coaches are encouraged to contact their AFCA representatives on ways to improve our game
